Literary Agent

You want a big New York publisher, but you've heard they don't take unsolicited manuscripts. The solution? **A literary agent.**

1. Ask fellow writers or publishers for a referral.
2. Read Guide to Literary Agents: 500+ Who Sell What You Write, The Insider's Guide to Getting an Agent, or many of the other good books on the subject.
3. Look under "agent" in Writers Market, Literary Marketplace, or your favorite search engine on the Internet.
4. Be sure to determine if the agent you choose has met the rigorous standards of the Association of Authors' Representatives (AAR) or the National Writers Union (NWU).
5. If a fee is charged, know what it's for. Most agents don't charge; they take a 15% commission on domestic sales.
